

- 3. Devise a system for the scientific, ideological, moral, spiritual and practical learning enabling the youth to serve the nation and the country skillfully and sincerely.





14. ON CAMPUS SERVICES & SALIENT FEATURES

14.1 Hostel





The students admitted may avail the hostel facility which offers a peaceful and learning friendly atmosphere. Students are expected to display good standard of disciplined behaviour in line with the teachings of Islam.

Things to do and not to do are the bases of living together. The following dos and don'ts are prescribed for the students for an amicable stay in the hostel. Students not abiding by these dos and don'ts are liable for strict disciplinary action leading to expulsion from the Hostel.

14.1.1 Dos

- 1. Offering five times ritual prayers along with Night-Vigil (Tahajjud) in the mosque is mandatory.
- 2. Fast for three days a month (Ayyam-e-Beed: 13th, 14th and 15th of every lunar month).
- 3. Take part in weekly "Mahfil-e-Dhikr-o-Fikr" and monthly "Majlis-e-Khatm-us-Salat 'ala al-Nabi ..."
- 4. Must attend the study period as per schedule.
- 5. Ensure to get permission from Hostel Warden, if a student intends to stay away from the hostel; even if it is just for one (1) night.
- 6. Keep the bed sheet, pillow and room clean / tidy at all times.
- 7. Safeguard the assents of the Institution and Minhaj-ul-Quran International.
- 8. Switch OFF all fans, lights & electrical appliances before leaving the room.
- 9. Observe the lights OFF timing at night which is 11:00 pm.
- 10. Beds are provided in all bedrooms & students are to bring their own pillows, bed sheets, blankets, towels, study lights, etc.
- 11. Beds must be covered with neat and clean bed sheets all the times.
- 12. Students are solely responsible for the safety of their own valuables. All bedroom doors and cupboards should be locked properly when the students are not inside the room.
- 13. Must consider the comfort level of other fellows in the room at all times.
- 14. Must report to Hostel Warden / Administration if something wrong / contrary to rules is observed in the room / hostel.
- 15. The rental must be paid by the 15th of every month. Failure to comply within 2 weeks after due date will result in EVICTION from the hostel.

14.1.2 Don'ts

- 1. Stay in the hostel room during class timings.
- 2. Conduct a private e-learning class from the room.
- 3. Lodge a guest (Father or Brother only) in the hostel for 1–2 days without prior permission of the administration.
- 4. Must not leave the hostel premises after specified timings; if extremely necessary, get the permission from hostel warden.
- 5. Should not change room or sleep anywhere other than own room without the consent of the hostel warden.
- 6. Indulge in fights or physical violence with any fellow student or any person within the hostel premises.
- 7. Cause embarrassment; unsolicited compliment regarding a person's figure, dressing, make-up; spreading false rumours with a view to tarnishing others' reputation.
- 8. Arrange parties / other social gatherings in the hostel complex without prior consent of the administrator / hostel warden.
- 9. Be in possession and / or dissemination of pornographic material (hard / soft copies).
- 10. Be in possession of weapon(s) or any items considered dangerous which can be used to cause injuries / bodily harm.
- 11. Smoke in the hostel complex / campus area at any time.
- 12. Be in possession and / or consumption of alcoholic beverage / drugs.
- 13. Cook in the room.
- 14. Use candles and other flammable material in rooms.
- 15. Act intentionally or unintentionally causing damage to the assents of COSIS / Minhaj-ul-Quran International.
- 16. Climb over the fence or wall to get in / out of the hostel.
- 17. Discuss sectarian / controversial religious issues that may lead to ugly situation.
- 18. Wear dress in violation of dress code / religious stipulation.
- 19. Possess valuable items / large amounts of cash in the hostel.
- 20. Paste posters, notes / pictures on the walls.
- 21. Drive nails, pins / screws in the walls or doors of the rooms.
- 22. Hang clothes on the banisters outside the rooms / on the window railings inside the room. Clothes found hanging in these places will be confiscated and disposed accordingly.
- 23. Keep following items:
 - (i) Hot Plate / Electric Heater

(ii) Microwave

(iii) Home Theatre System

(iv) Washing Machine

(v) Exercise Machine

(vi) Music Instruments: Piano / Organ / Drums

14.2 Campus Management System (CMS)

The Campus Management System is designed to promote paperless work. It is unique and comprehensive software which hosts the features that allow users to maintain academic history of students with complete transparency in records and provides a medium for teachers, staff and administration to work in harmony.

The application also facilitates students to view their personal data related to academics and fee details. The system has a complete role based access where various resources are made available depending upon the role assigned.

14.3 CMS Rules

- 1. IT Manager will allot Login IDs / Passwords to all authorized users (students) and will arrange their training for working in particular module.
- 2. All students will Login to CMS using their Login IDs / Passwords; they must change their Passwords to strengthen the secrecy of their accounts.
- 3. Every student will be responsible for his account's security, so he must not share his ID / Password with anyone.
- 4. Ensure to check your data and instructions of Administration / Faculty on regular basis.
- 5. Must not mishandle system and must use CMS as per directions of the IT Manager.

14.4 Computer Laboratory

The College has two well equipped computer laboratories having sufficient number of computers connected through LAN with high speed internet connection at both campuses which facilitate students' computer training besides providing them the opportunity to know the world of information technology.



14.5 Library & Research Institute





Library being the hub of knowledge plays an important role in research work, thus it is considered the backbone of any educational institution. To facilitate the students in learning process, COSIS has established two libraries (one each at both the campuses) with substantial number of books ranging from primary sources, such as hadith collections and Qur'anic exegesis to literature covering classical manuals on Islamic law, Islamic civilization, culture and social studies.

Efforts have been made to provide clean, calm and healthy atmosphere. Farid-e-Millat Research Institute (FMRi) is another great source of research at Model Town Campus where research scholars are welcomed to facilitate them in their research work.







14.6 Security Arrangements

Strict arrangements have been made for the security and protection of the students. Guards are posted round the clock and nobody is allowed to enter the premises and meet the students except with prior intimation and permission.



14.7 Health Care

A state-of-the-art dispensary provides medical help on 24/7 basis to students. A qualified MBBS medical officer is appointed for the purpose. Students who fall sick are treated in the hostel premises. An ambulance is also available to carry the patients to hospital in case of emergency.





14.8 Cafeteria / Canteen

To facilitate the students during leisure time, services are provided through cafeteria / canteen at the college premises. It provides students what they need: good quality eatables, stationery, washing material, etc.





14.9 Career Counseling

Choosing educational and professional careers according to one's predilection, skills, interests and aptitude is the key to success in life. Career counselling plays an important role in guiding the students towards future academic and professional directions. This has been organized under the supervision of students' counsellor who is always available to resolve the queries. Weak students are given special attention to improve their studies.





14.10 Brilliant Future

Job opportunities are available in the educational centres, Islamic centres, schools and colleges established by Minhaj-ul-Quran International (MQI) in Pakistan as well as worldwide. Many graduates who passed out from this college are serving in various capacities (education, armed forces, civil services and research) through their selection by public service commissions and other provincial selection boards.

The graduates of this institution are playing their part in conveying the universal message of Islam in the form of Friday sermons and lectures on the Holy Qur'an and hadith. More than 200 graduates are performing their duties in the Islamic centres of MQI abroad.

·15. RULES AND REGULATIONS

Semester Rules

- a. There shall be two regular semesters in an academic year. Moreover, one summer session of eight weeks duration can be planned on required basis.
- b. Each semester will be of 16-18 working weeks (sixteen weeks for teaching, one week for conduct of examination and one week for finalization of result).
 - c. The contact hours during the Summer Semester will be doubled.

The teacher will provide a detailed course outline to the students within three days of the beginning of the semester and shall send a copy of the course outline and work plan to the Dean/ Principal.

15.1 Course Credit Hours

- a. A credit hour means teaching/earning a theory course for one hour each week throughout the semester.
- b. One credit hour in laboratory or practical work/project would require lab contact of three hours per week throughout the semester.

15.2 Course Repeat/Improvement of CGPA

•

- a. Whenever a student fails (gets 'F' grade), he has to repeat the course whenever offered.
- b. Undergraduate Students can repeat a 'D' grade if the CGPA is less than 2.00. Master Program Students can repeat a 'C' grade if the CGPA is less than 2.50.
- A student can be allowed to repeat a maximum of six courses (18 credit hours) to improve their grades at undergraduate level. Master level students can be allowed to repeat a maximum of three courses (09 credit hours) to improve their grades.

15.3 Withdrawal and Change of Courses

- a. When a course, for which a student has been enrolled, cannot be offered according to the announced program, the student may take an alternative course. However this must be done not later than seven (7) days after the date of enrollment.
 - b. A student with the consent of concerned Dean/HOD, may be allowed to:-
 - (1) Change a course within seven (7) days of commencement of a semester or
 - (2) Drop a course within five (5) weeks of the commencement of a semester.
- c. Withdrawal from a course will be allowed latest by one week before the semester examination (i.e. by the end of 14th week) with the approval of the course Incharge and Dean/ HOD. Withdrawn course will appear on transcript with letter grade 'W' and will not be treated as 'F' grade.

·15.4 Code of Examination

- a. All students must submit the clearance form to Exam Office at least One Week prior to start of Exam. Failing to this will not be allowed to sit in the Exam.
 - b. Students having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to sit for the Exam.
 - c. All dues must be cleared to appear in the Exam.
 - d. Students using unfair means in the Exam will be penalized as per policy.

16. BS Level

- a. The teacher is responsible for the evaluation of work/ performance of the students of his/ her class and for the award of grades to them on the basis of such evaluation.
- b. The weightage of Mid Term Exam is 25%, Assignment, Quizzes and Attendance is 25% (10%, 10%, and 5% respectively) and Final Term Exam is 50%.
- c. BS-8 students will submit a research paper (Thesis) which carries 200 marks.
- d. In case a student joins a course after it has started, he/ she will be responsible for any missed quizzes, assignments and lectures. The marks for missed quizzes will be considered zero; however, makeup assignments can be arranged in consultation with the teacher/ HOD.
- e. There will be no Supplementary Exam in Semester System; if a student fails, he/ she have to repeat the course when it is offered.
- f. The Mid Term Exam may be held after eight weeks from the start of semester.
- g. The examinations shall be held on consecutive days excluding holidays which means that no gap shall be allowed between the papers.
- h. Each course shall carry at least one assignment which shall be submitted to the concerned teacher.
- i. The time limit for completion of BS[Hons] degree shall be ordinarily four years Program from the start of the first semester counted towards the degree but a student repeating the course shall be considered as a special casual student; the time limit for such a student will be extendable up to maximum of one year.
- j. In case of genuine reason, a student may freeze his/ her studies maximum for one year subject to the permission of the Dean/ Principal. During the freezing period the applicant will lose his studentship and shall not be entitled to avail any facility being extended to regular students.

· a. CGPA Required for Completion of UG and Graduate Degree

(i) To complete the degree, the minimum qualifying CGPA for BS is 2.00.

Whenever a BS student's CGPA is less than 2.00, then he/ she will be placed on 1st probation for the next semester. Maximum two probations are allowed to come up to the desired minimum CGPA otherwise the student will be dropped from the Rolls of the Department.

c. Withdrawal from a course will be allowed latest by one week before the semester examination (i.e. by the end of 14th week) with the approval of the course Incharge and Dean/ HOD. Withdrawn course will appear on transcript with letter grade 'W' and will not be treated as 'F' grade.

b. Requirements for Award of Degrees

BS Students

- (i) A student must have a regular admission in the undergraduate program of the Department.
- (ii) Should earn a minimum of 60 credit hours out of a total of 124–130 credit hours from the Department from where he will be entitled for the degree.

· c. Fee Concession Rules

• i. Sons of Teachers/staff: 100 % in Tuition and Hostel fee

ii. Two or more real brothers (the younger only): 50 % in Tuition fee
iii. Sons of members of IMQ: 10 % in Tuition fee.
iv. Students of Tafeez-ul-Quran: 50% in Tuition fee
v. Residents of Sindh, Baluchistan and Gilgit Baltistan: 50% in Tuition fee

d. Scholarships

• a. Students will get concession during BS-1 semester on the basis of their performance in Intermediate Board Exam as under:-

(i) Position holders in Board Exam: 100 % in Tuition and Hostel Fee

(ii) On getting 90% and above marks: 100 % in Tuition Fee (iii) On getting 85% and above marks: 75 % in Tuition Fee (iv) On getting 80% and above marks: 50 % in Tuition Fee

b. From BS-2 to BS-8 only top position holders will get 50 % concession in Tuition Fee.

e. Admission Criteria

- * Minimum qualification is mentioned as above. In addition, the HEC admission criteria and rules & regulations will also be implemented.
- f. Admission Conditions
- i. Admission application will be accepted only on prescribed application form.
- ii. Admission is granted on merit base after test/interview.
- iii. 2% admission will be granted on quota system for the distant areas of Gilgit Baltistan, Baluchistan, Sindh and KPK.
- iv. Admission will be confirmed after deposit of all dues.
- v. Relaxation in age limit can only be granted to genuine cases through an application.
- vi. Hostel facility is given according to the availability of seats.

g. Additional Marks for Merit List

a. Additional marks will be added in merit result as under:-

(i) Hafiz-i-Quran: 15 Marks
 (ii) Sports: 15 Marks
 (iii) Arabic/ English Language 15 Marks
 (iv) Staff IMQ/ Teachers' Son 10 Marks

b. The applicants have to submit the relevant certificate to get the additional marks.

h. Documents to be submitted: -

- i. Attested copy of Matric/ Intermediate/ BS certificate/ transcript.
- ii. Character certificate of previous institution.
- iii. Attested copy of B-Form/ CNIC of the candidate.
- iv. Attested copy of CNIC of the father/ guardian.
- v. Four colored pictures with white background.
- vi. Original NOC from respective Board (Except Lahore Board).

• i. Actions leading to Cancellation of Admission

- i. Remains absent for six (6) days consecutively.
- ii. Careless attitude towards specified timings of Assembly/ Classes/ Extracurricular Activities.
- iii. Failing to deposit dues by specific date.
- iv. Not taking interest in curricular and extracurricular activities.
- v. Non-cooperation with Teachers and Administration.
- vi. Using unfair means in Exams.
- vii. Not abiding by the policy, rules and regulations of the institution.
- viii. On cancellation of admission due to any reason Hostel Seat will be cancelled automatically.

j. Re-Admission

- I. On suspension or cancellation of admission, a student has to put up an application to Principal Office for Re- enrollment/ Re- admission.
- ii. Arrange meeting of parents/ guardian with the Principal.
- iii. On suspension of admission, re- enrollment fee is Rs. 500/. If re-enrollment is not done on 4th day from the start of absentee, then student has to pay Rs.100 per day along with re-enrollment fee Rs. 500.

On cancellation of admission, re- admission fee is Rs. 1000/. If re-admission is not done on 7th day from the start of absentee, then a student has to pay Rs.100 per day along with re-admission fee Rs. 1000.

a. Attendance/ Leave policy

Attendance

- A. Attendance in morning Assembly is mandatory for all students.
- B. Students falling sick have to report to their class Incharge.
- C. A student must have attended at least 80% of the classes held in a course in order to be allowed to sit in the final examination.
- D. A student having less than 80% attendance but more than 75% in a particular course, making up the deficiency in consultation with the concerned teacher, may be allowed by the Institute Council.
- E. Students having class attendance less than 75% in particular course will be required to repeat the course when it is offered again.

A fine of Rs.50/ for Absentee/ Late in morning Assembly and Rs.20/ for Absentee/ Late in one period during classes will be imposed.

ii. Duty/ Urgent Work Leave

- A. Leave application will be submitted on the prescribed form only.
- B. Duty leave can only be granted for official duty or when a student has to appear in some specific examination. This leave has to be approved in advance after producing supported documents (date sheet, etc.).
- C. For urgent work/ death of close relative, students have to get the leave approved from respective class Incharge/ Principal Office in advance.
- D. Urgent work leave up to three days will be approved by class Incharge.
- E. Beyond three days, urgent work leave will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of class Incharge.
- Leave is not granted before or after the Exam, vacations and Itikaf training camp. Absent students will be fined Rs.500/- per day.

iii. Medical Leave

- A. If a student falls sick while staying in the Hostel, he has to inform his class Incharge for reporting sick.
- B. If any student falls severely sick while at home, his parents have to inform his class Incharge immediately.
- C. After recovery, a student has to report to his class Incharge without wastage of time and apply for medical leave supported with test reports/ medical documents (having advice of Specialist for bed rest) within three days of return to college.
- D. Late applications will not be accepted. Moreover, medical leave will only be granted if a student informs his class Incharge before leaving the class/college for medical treatment.

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- A. Attendance in morning Assembly is mandatory for all students.
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- D. Late applications will not be accepted. Moreover, medical leave will only be granted if a student informs his class Incharge before leaving the class/college for medical treatment.

A. If any student falls short of 75 % attendance, maximum 10 % can be adjusted as medical leave which means any student with less than 65 % attendance cannot qualify to sit in the final examination even if his medical application is approved. However, cases of severe illness may be given additional waver by College Council according to the Board/ HEC policy.

17. CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- a. Administration expects all students to be well behaved and well-disciplined during their studies at the Institute. Any contrary behavior is liable to disciplinary action which may result in fine, expulsion or rustication, depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence.
- b. Being self-disciplined and punctual is highly appreciated.
- c. All students must abide by the ideology of Minhaj ul Qur'an. Using abusive language or remarks for the administration/ higher authorities of the

Institute or anyone else is strictly forbidden.

- d. Sectarianism is totally banned. Everyone must not discuss about this issue.
- e. All students are to uphold the highest values of academic integrity. Violations include and are not limited to: plagiarism, cheating, fabrication, and academic misconduct.



- f. Dishonesty/ falsification of information are discouraged at all levels. Students will be considered in violation of "code of conduct" if they:-
- (i) Lie or furnish false information at any stage.
- (ii) Are aware of false information being furnished by others with the intent to deceive and do not correct that false information in a timely manner.
- (iii) Withhold information pertinent to student misconduct.
- (iv) Fabricate, alter, counterfeit or misuse any official documents or resources.
- (v) Intentionally issue a bad cheque/payment or other financial instrument in order to register for classes or receive an official transcript or diploma.
- (vi) Provide false information or fail to provide current information for the purpose of defrauding.
- g. No student shall intentionally or negligently damage, attempt to damage, or participate in the damage of property belonging to or in the care of Al-A'zamiyya Institute and Minhaj ul Qur'an International.
- h. Damage that is caused accidentally should be promptly reported to the Administration.
- i. Students shall follow the dress code and avoid using mobile phones in the classes.
